- 5% of families earn more than 200% of FPIL.



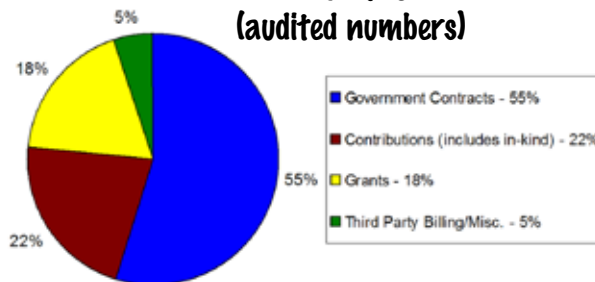
Any Baby Can Served More Than 6,000 Children and Their Families in FY 2009
